# **PURPOSE**

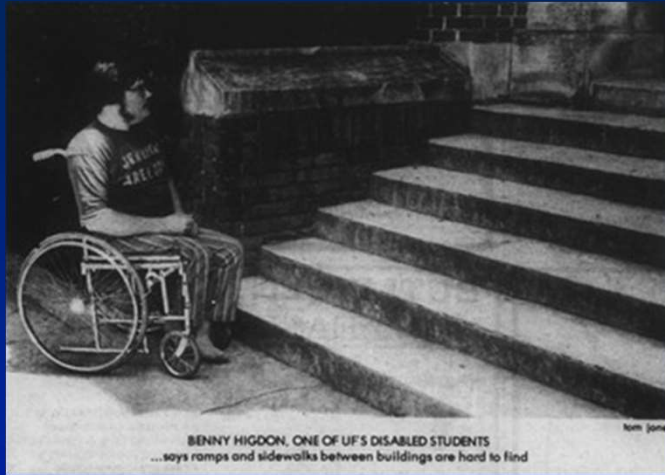
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The Disability Resource Center (DRC) removes barriers and engages with students, faculty and staff to promote an accessible campus community for all.

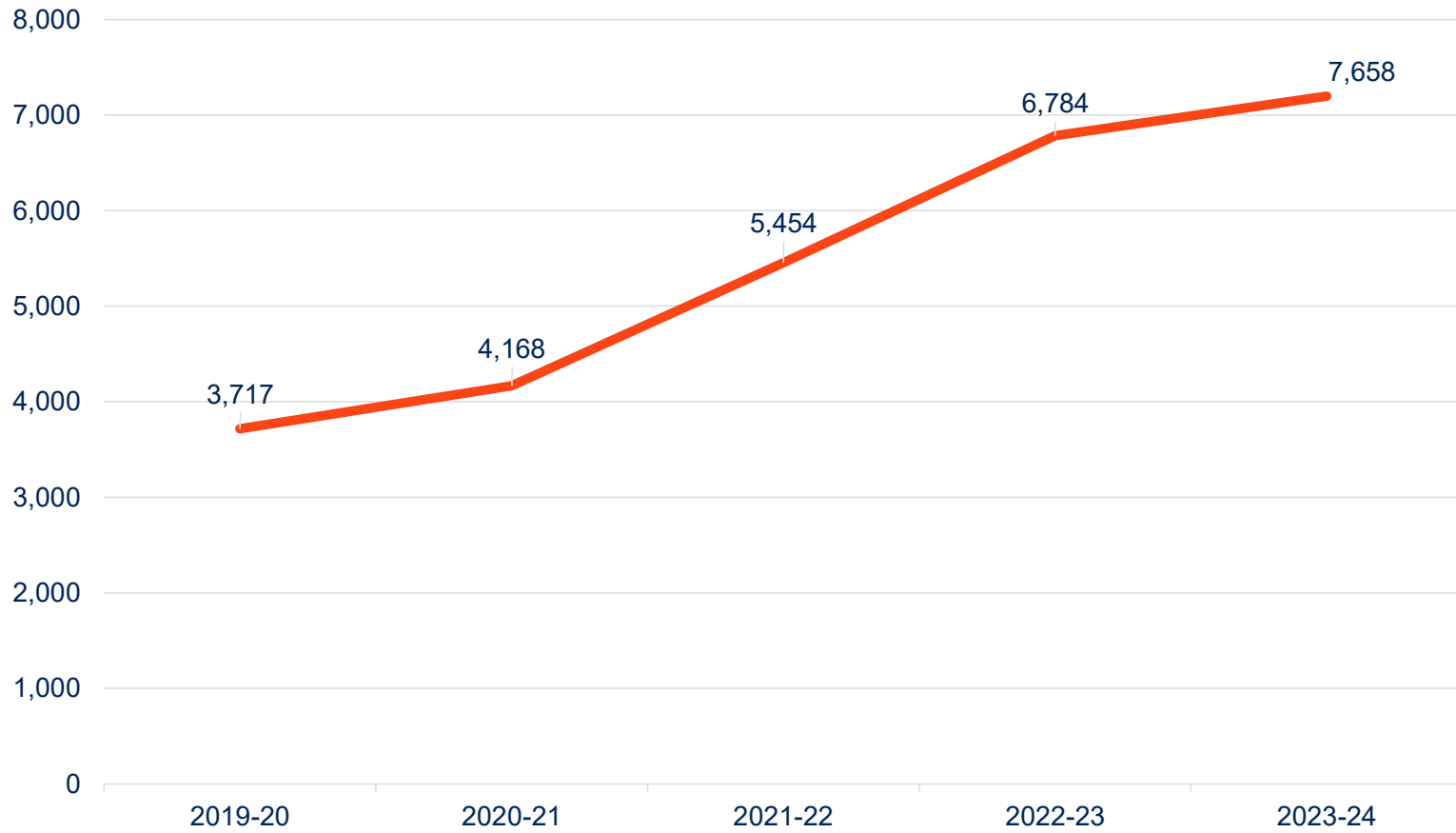

## Inquiry

- Informal meeting or Q&A to learn about the DRC

## Initial

- Interactive meeting to determine current barriers and appropriate reasonable accommodations

## Follow-Up

- Update accommodations, identify new barriers, address course concern

- Ongoing Communication



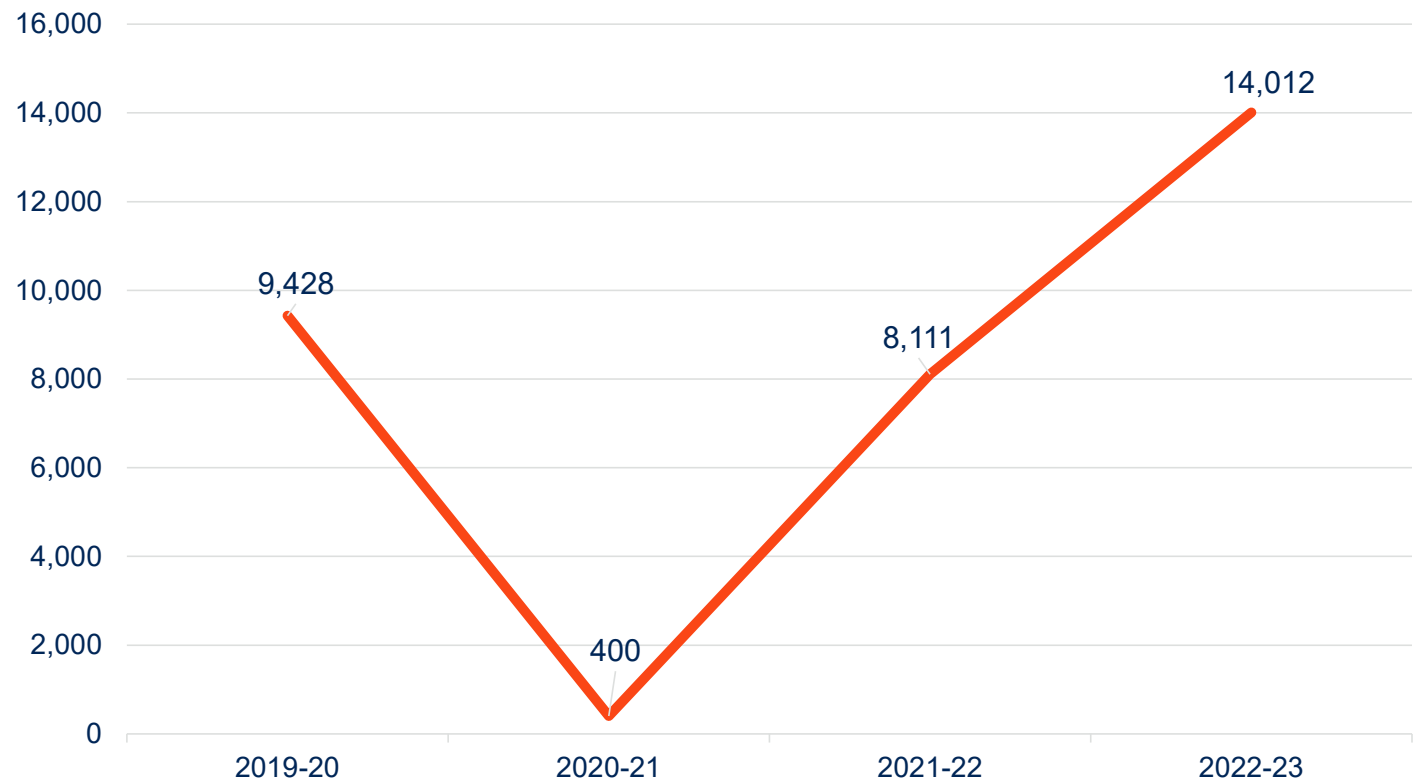


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# DRC TESTING OFFICE

## TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS

- Instructors must create the test in G-ATR before students can create their ATRs
- Students use the G-ATR portal to create test requests, based on instructor's test information
