On Campus Events with Tara

The Office of the Vice President for Business Affairs is responsible for the rules pertaining to how space is utilized on campus. One of the great ways this is managed is the GatorConnect permitting system with permit requests for General Events (including alcohol requests), Tabling Events, Requests to Serve Alcoholic Beverages in <u>Select Space</u>, Runs & Walks, Banners, Yard Signs and even the lighting of Century Tower.

*How do I know if my event or gathering requires a permit?*The best place to start is by referring to section 4.1 in the <u>Use of University Space</u> policy.

While this is a non-exhaustive list it will set you in the right direction.

Where do I submit a request for a permit?

Please visit the Business Affairs website <u>here</u> to access the link to GatorConnect. Registered Student Organizations have a different process and will need to login to their Organization's account and submit a request with Student Activities and Involvement.

Where can I find all of the policies about how I'm allowed to use space on campus? Both the regulations and policies are managed by the Office of the Vice President and General Counsel. Most of the regulations you'll likely need are in section <u>2-Public Functions</u>. Policies can be found on the <u>UF Policy Hub</u>.

Clery Corner with Dr. D

Lots of updates from the Clery Compliance program:

The <u>Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Program (DAAPP)</u>, a requirement of the Drug Free Schools and Community Act, can be viewed on the UFCE website. The DAAPP is a collaborative program with partners from GatorWell, Employee Relations, University Athletic Association, the Division of Student Life,

Student Conduct and Conflict Resolution, University of Florida Police Department, and the Clery Compliance program.

Look for the 2022 <u>Annual Security and Fire Safety Reports</u> coming this fall! These documents include over 116 statements of policy regarding campus safety and crime prevention programs, along with 3 years of crime data for all of UF's Clery campuses.

Notification of <u>Campus Security Authority</u> (CSA) training will also be sent this fall to all new and continuing CSAs. If you receive a notice for training, you have been identified as a CSA. Be sure to complete the training course through myTraining.

Lastly, **UF Alert Day** will be November 29th! More information will be shared University-wide regarding the events planned for the day.

Title IX Updates

On June 23, 2022, the U.S. Department of Education released the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) for Title IX. These proposed changes will expand the scope of Title IX and limit the burden placed on institutions.



The expansion of scope would cover all forms of sex-based harassment, including discrimination on the basis of sex stereotypes, sex characteristics, pregnancy or related conditions, sexual orientation, and gender identity. Mandated training and reporting requirements would also be expanded to include additional institutional employees. Lastly, the NPRM proposes an update to the processes for investigating and adjudicating discrimination on the basis of sex.

The Department's proposed Title IX regulations are now open for the 60 day public comment period following the publication in the Federal Register on July 12, 2022. Comments can be submitted through the <u>Federal eRulemaking Portal</u>.

EH&S is committed to support a safe working environment for the UF community members and foster a culture of safety in research labs, student areas, maker


